

Advent Reflection: The Gift of Ourselves

The beloved Christmas song The Little Drummer Boy offers a simple yet profound message that resonates deeply during this Advent season. The young drummer boy, feeling he has nothing worthy to offer the newborn King, gives the only gift he can—his music. His humble act of love and devotion reminds us that what matters most is not the size or value of our gifts, but the heart with which they are given.

Advent invites us to reflect on the relationships that shape our lives, especially our relationship with Christ. God has uniquely blessed each of us with gifts and talents—not to keep for ourselves but to use for His glory and the good of others. Like the drummer boy, when we recognize and share these gifts, we not only experience joy but also spread it, fostering deeper connections with those around us.

This season of preparation challenges us to focus less on material offerings and more on the gift of ourselves. How can we use our time, talents, and love to serve others and honor Christ?
