





Year of the Eucharist Reflection

The ancient Liturgy of St. James has its roots in Jerusalem and Antioch and is still in use among Eastern rite churches. The following prayer, known as the "Prayer of the Veil," is fashioned after St. Paul's words in the Letter to the Hebrews: "Having therefore, brothers, confidence in entering into the holies by the blood of Christ; a new and living way which he has dedicated for us through the veil, that is to say, his flesh" (Heb 10:19-20). This liturgical prayer underscores the truth that Christ's human flesh is the new temple veil whereby man has access to the holy of holies, God Himself.

"We thank You Lord, our God, for You have given us confidence to enter into Your holy place, which You have renewed for us as an undefiled and living way through the veil of the flesh of Your Christ. Having been made worthy to enter into the place of Your glorious dwelling, to come within the veil, and to look upon the holy of holies, we fall down before Your goodness. Master, be merciful to us. In fear and trembling, we prepare to stand before Your holy altar to offer this awesome and unbloody sacrifice for our sins and for the errors of humanity. O God, send Your good grace; sanctify our souls, bodies, and spirits. Turn our minds toward godliness so that in good conscience, we may offer You a sacrifice of praise. [Accomplish this by the mercy and love of Your only begotten Son for mankind, with whom You and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit are now and forever."




Backpacks and School Supplies


