

# **Year of the Eucharist Reflection**

St. Joseph Cafasso (1811-1860) was an Italian priest who dedicated himself to serving the outcast and imprisoned. In this passage, St. Joseph movingly writes of the renovation of cultures due to the cult of the Blessed Sacrament. By making daily visits to the Blessed Sacrament, Christians express its centrality in their lives. St. Joseph singles out priests as exemplars for this practice as they are uniquely positioned to establish religious norms.

I know of certain countries where churches were always empty on workdays, but after priests began to practice visits to the Most Blessed Sacrament and recommend it to others, it was a marvel to see the gathering of people in the church; artists, peasants, old men, youths, all walking to the church at evening to thank the Lord. They were not only called by their faith, but by the example of the good priest. So, I cannot recommend a more holy, excellent, and exemplary practice for the people than to visit our good God.

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,





Although my Installation as Pastor does not take place until September 28th, canonically I became pastor on July 1st! I am now officially entering the first year of of my first six-year appointment! That being said I thought I would take a moment to look back at the past year; and wow has it been a busy year!

So, let's start with the big changes you all are aware of, many of which were in planning months prior to my assignment began. We remodeled the confessional, giving it a solemn and reflective feel. We also remodeled the gathering space and main bathrooms. We completely redid the landscaping to address the security concerns and overgrowth issues. We upgraded the lights in the Church, gathering space, a couple offices and most recently the main sacristy. One of our own has been taking on these smaller upgrades for the parish, so thank you Hugh Montague for all your hard work. Through the generosity of parishioners, we have added the Traditional Stations of the Cross in the Main Church, which allowed us to move the JPII Stations to the Great Hall, we have been able to add the Immaculate Heart of Mary and Sacred Heart of Jesus Icons to the Main Church and the Divine Mercy and Our Lady of Guadalupe Icons to the Great Hall. We have also been blessed with a number of new sacramentals, through generous donations, that have enhanced our worship. We also commissioned a company to replace the side entrance sign; you may have noticed it missing. The new one should be arriving soon! And lastly, we added a game room in the youth hall to help foster community among our teens, as well as the wall of saints in the Faith Formation Tower to inspire them.

In addition to these asthetic changes and much needed upgrades, we've also had several changes in personnel. Cheryl Ellsworth and Maggie Provine retired this past year and have been greatly missed around the office. Danny Torres, Liam Havlicek, and Jordan Torres left for other employment opportunities. We also ended our contract with BOLD Youth Ministry. However, amid these many departures we have had some incredible new people join the parish team as well. Bladimir Gonzalez-Ibima, our new head of maintenance, is one of the hardest working and joy-filled people I have ever met. We have also had Carter Malin, Jenna Manolakos and Sarah Fernandes join us as our weekend maintenance helpers. Stephanie Simms joined us as the Pastor's Secretary. And of course, we have been blessed to have Matt Simms join us this past year as our Youth Minister. Sadly, he has left us for a teaching position at a Jesuit High School in Tampa, Florida. Thankfully, Nick Cheniara has agreed to come on to run the high school youth group until we are able to bring on a permanent youth minister. We have also had the blessing of Tara Misiura helping us with the bulletin and our communications efforts as we awaited our newest employee, Judy Rynkewicz, who is our new Coordinator of Communications.

We have also had some fun this past year with a temperamental HVAC unit, mysterious leaks that are mostly identified and fixed at this point, and of course a few rusty pipes that sprung leaks! We even had two roof drain clogs that brought attention to the fact that the construction crew who built the church back in the 1980s drywalled over the access joints. And of course, the ongoing issues with our Baptismal Font, which we are working on replacing. So, never a dull moment!

Of course, we have also been evaluating our liturgical schedule and spiritual offerings. We expanded daily Mass to 5 days a week. We added Thursday Evening Confessions, which started out very quiet, but now has a steady stream of people coming every week to experience the love and mercy of Christ. We also piloted the Sunday evening mass and through the feedback of many settled on permanently adding the 7pm Sunday mass to our weekend schedule. We also added Eucharistic Adoration before our Monday, Wednesday and Friday daily masses, which also has a growing group of people taking time to be with Christ through this intimate form of prayer and devotion. Oh, I cannot forget the beautiful Choral Rosary that was done with our May Crowning and our first annual Divine Mercy celebration. And of course, the addition of the First Friday and Saturday Devotions, the Miraculous Medal Novena Monday's after mass and the St. Jude Novena Wednesday's after Mass. Lastly, thanks to our Pastoral Council we now have the Children's Mass Library so that the children at mass can grab a book about the mass a learn what is taking place.

We have also had several social opportunities and celebrations, including Fr. Tim's Anniversary, the Columbiettes Grand Tea Party and the Knights of Columbus' first Fish Fry in Lent. Can't forget our Summer Faith, Film & Food events that were a huge success last year. Be sure to join us this summer (see bulletin for info). I am also looking forward to our Parish Picnic on September 28th, and I hope you plan to attend! Many individuals are working hard to make it a memorable and fun Sunday afternoon; it will also be the first time the Feast of Saint David the King, our patron, is celebrated; the Bishop has granted a dispensation to observe his feast day that weekend.

Of course, all the above wouldn't have been possible without your support and prayers. Thank you for having confidence in me as your administrator this past year. The words of advice and feedback have been helpful and encouraging. I am looking forward to the many years ahead! We already have many projects and initiatives being discussed, ranging from the upgrading of the youth hall lights, the youth hall kitchen being transformed into a coffee shop and the thought of a grotto to our blessed mother being built outside near the Great Hall. For now, I want to focus on thank you; I simply cannot say that enough. Ok, well... Let's begin year two!


