YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST REFLECTION

St. Gregory of Nyssa (c. 335-395) here observes how perfumes tend to diffuse themselves, imparting their sweet scents to others. Applying this idea to rate Himself, ot. regory explains how Christ desires to communicate Himself to man in the Blessed Sacrament. Having contracted the foulness of sin, man may cleanse and perfume himself with the odor of sanctity found in this sacrament. Rightly then do Christians relish the sweetness of grace found therein.

"Whatever is received in nature goes on to transform the re-ceiver. For example, the mouth of one who receives some sweet smelling aroma becomes fragrant. And again, for the one who consumes garlic, or something more pungent, his mouth becomes foul smelling. So, all filth of sin is foul smelling, and the opposite is true of Christ's virtue; it is sweet smelling. And a loving union naturally effects a mingling with the beloved.

Whatever we proclaim through love is the very thing we be-come, either the fragrance of Christ or a foul smell. For, the one who loves goodness is himself good —as the goodness of it transforms the receiver into itself. For this reason, He who lives forever places Himself before us as food so that once we receive Him in them, we may become precisely what He is.

For He says, "my flesh is truly food, and my blood truly drink" (John 6:55]. So, the one who loves this flesh is not a friend of his own flesh. And the one who arranged His blood for this purpose will cleanse our bodily blood. The flesh of the Word, and the blood in that flesh, does not have one kind of grace only. Rather, He becomes sweet to those who taste, and desirable to those who desire, and beloved to those who love."




