

#### YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST REFLECTION

After his ordination to the priesthood, St. Vincent de Paul (1581-1660) was taken captive by Barbary pirates and sold into slavery. After converting his Muslim captors, Vincent returned to Europe, resumed his priestly service, and established the Congregation of the Mission and the Daughters of Charity.

In the following sermon, St. Vincent paints an arresting picture of the Mass and its fulfillment of the rituals of the Old Covenant. Whereas the temple of old was made of stone, Christ has made men living stones, filled with the Holy Spirit and sated with His Precious Blood.

It is no longer the angel of the Lord who proclaims God's will to men from the Mercy Seat. Rather, it is Jesus Christ Himself who, before returning to heaven whence He descended for our salvation, left us this August Testament in which is contained all that we must believe.

For here, the victim offered is the Lamb of God, the consecrated bread is the Bread of Angels and of men, and the mysterious wine that we receive at Holy Mass is the Drink of the Saints in heaven.

Indeed, the prayers that are said, and the hymns that are chanted, are those songs of joy that the blessed spirits proclaim, resounding in the realm of glory. Indeed, our bodily temples are the new heaven, which the Prophet had promised to men [see Jer 31:31; 1 Cor 6:19].

#### AN IMPORTANT UPDATE ON OUR SOCIAL CONCERNS MINISTRY

Recently Fr. Jason met with Social Concerns to share his vision for this important ministry and would like to share that with you today.

What is our Social Concerns mission? "To foster a sense of charity through opportunities to serve."

#### What is changing

We will no longer have a Social Concerns Annual Appeal in October. Now through your generous weekly tithing donations to the parish, we will set aside funds to assist Social Concerns ministry with active projects they embark on as needed.

In the past, Social Concerns made donations from the appeal to local charities on your behalf. Now they will make you aware of local charities that you may wish to directly connect with, so that you may learn how to serve those in need through donating your time, talent or treasure to those organizations.

#### What isn't changing

Please be assured that the Social Concerns Ministry will continue to promote opportunities for all of us to engage in direct service to those in need, like volunteering at the CYO, as well as opportunities to assist in providing for the basic needs for those struggling in our community, i.e. backpack collection, meal baskets, Christmas giving tree, food donations etc. And there may be additional opportunities in the future. As you can see, your continued assistance is greatly needed for all these important endeavors.

At the parish level, as before, we will assist parishioners on a temporary basis in times of great need due to an unfortunate circumstance in their life. For their longer-term needs, where we lack the competency or ability, we will collaborate with the diocese and catholic service organizations to ensure that our desire to help truly makes a difference in the way intended.

In the past, members of the surrounding community or sometimes out of town individuals have come to the pastor seeking assistance. These instances were rarely handled by Social Concerns but if referred to them, they sent these individuals to catholic service organizations such as the Diocesan Social Services office, Catholic Charities, Mount Carmel Guild, etc. The parish will continue making these referrals.

Change is uncomfortable, but we hope that you join us, along with the Social Concerns Ministry team, in embracing the mission to 'foster a sense of charity through opportunities to serve.' Christian Service is rooted in relationship with each other, with Christ at the center bringing us together.

#### WHY REGISTER IN THE PARISH?

Registration is the official way of joining the parish. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they are automatically members.

Registration is a commitment to the community; a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish.

It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate, Letter of Eligibility and contribution statements for your tax return preparation.

Adult children no longer living in the family home should register in their own name.

Registration is as simple as stopping by the office, contacting Vivian at <u>parishoffice@stdavidtheking.com</u> or calling 609-275-7111, option 5 to get the registration package and formally enroll.
